

## **REPORT ON IANN WORKSHOP**

**Theme:** ***“Quality improvement in neonatal care through simulation”***

This workshop was organized by Nursing College, AIIMS Bhopal in association with IANN on the themes **“Quality improvement in neonatal care through simulation”** on 24<sup>th</sup> March. 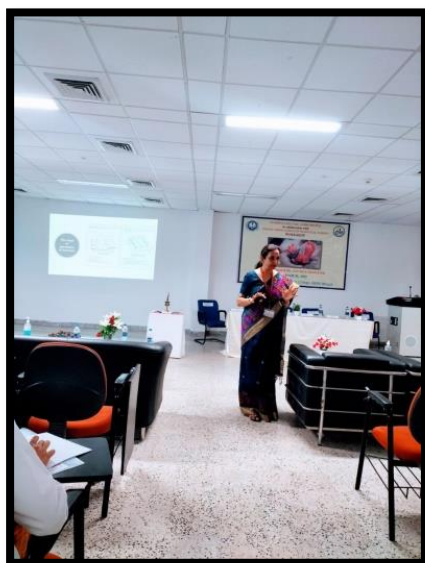
